<p>About: The Professional Education Course Program is a non-degree program designed for individuals who have completed a Bachelor's degree in any field and who intend to teach at the secondary education level. In line with the provisions of RA 7836 (The Philippine Teachers Professionalization Act of 1994), the program aims to provide non-education degree holders with individuals who complete the PEC are given a certification (NOT a degree or diploma) that they have completed the 18-unit professional education requirement to be allowed to take the Licensure Examination for Teachers (LET) which is administered by the Professional Regulatory Commission (PRC).</p>
